Noun can be grouped into two categories: count and noncount nouns.

Count Nouns

Can have a/an in front of them- Tom likes to eat an apple and an egg for breakfast.

Can have plural forms. Susan likes pancakes for breakfast.

Can have a number in front of them. Tom ate three hamburgers for dinner yesterday.

Can take singular or plural verbs. I ate a hamburger at McDonald's today.

Can be in questions with how many. How many hamburgers did Tom eat?
